How can we strike a balance between the need to protect children from harm and the need to allow them the opportunity to take reasonable risks, learn from mistakes and develop resilience? In recent months, there have been suggestions that the development of anti-bullying policies in schools and exaggerated concerns for children's safety have contributed to a lessening of children's resilience and of their capacity to learn to judge what is and is not an acceptable risk. For those of us who have long campaigned vigorously for issues such as bullying and child abuse to be taken seriously, this is a difficult charge to accept. But it is one that should be faced.
